MODEST

PROPOSAL

This article was taken from the April/June 1983 issue of the Digest. Attributed to Mz. R.U. Reddy and gleaned from Teckel Tales, newsletter of the Eastern Canada Dachshund Club. I have revised it slightly. 35 years later, we are still "reddy" for separation!

I would like to suggest the creation of Group 8 - The Dachshund Group. I had already considered the Teckel Group, but AKC would never accept the word Teckel. I also considered. then rejected, the suggestion of calling Group 8 - the Non-Working Group (inspiration from group 6 - The Non-Sporting Group). Think about it dear Dachshund doggy people - our own Group! No more being backed up behind the backsides of Bassets or Beagles; no more being rudely run over by roadrunner handlers on acrobatic Afghans; no more "token Teckel"

cuts in Group; a guaranteed table in our ring; and our own set of Group 8 judges. Oh, Joy—OH, JOY!!

We could not have a Group 8 with only 6 breeds in it. No indeed—unimpressive to a point, and think of the egos of the two who did not place...shameful... shoddy!

I PROPOSE THAT WE HAVE 24 BREEDS OF DACHSHUNDS. We would simply increase from the present 3 coat types times the two sizes, to six coats in four sizes. Not at all unreasonable. The four sizes are easy—in addition to Miniatures and Standards we would expand to include the other two sizes often seen today - the Giants and Sub-standards. Giants would be those dogs that weigh from 30 pounds upwards. The Sub-standards would be those which are not quite Miniatures nor yet are they Standards. However, since the word

Sub-standard could never be truthfully used on a Dachshund, we require a better term. I like the word Tweenie – it is infinitely more appropriate.

Adding three new coats is more complex. After careful study of existing Longhaired, Smooth and Wirehaired Dackels in kennels and "docksees" at shows, I feel that to meet the need plausibly, we must add Curly, Fluffy, and Bald. This would give us 24 breeds.

It will take earnest effort by devoted Dachshund developers to attain perfection in these new breeds. The "Official Breed Standard" will require a little adaptation, but considering the zeal of canine persons when it comes to changing their respective Breed Standards, this can be done post haste. Co-operation by "Registrations" will be essential to filter out from the existing breeds, those true Tweenies and Giants. We already know that these sizes can be readily produced. Perfecting new coats will be more challenging and require more time.

The Curly Coated Dachshund would not be impossible to develop from the present Longhairs. In fact, in the back of kennels, or in "suitable pet homes" around the country, there probably already exists sufficient breeding stock which, if ferreted out, would form the foundation for the Curly. After consideration, I feel that it would be unrealistic to attempt a very long curly coat. A coat similar to that of the Irish Water Spaniel would suffice. I must admit, however, that a truly long and curly coat, one which would suitably "cord" would verily be an innovation. For the present, this might be better "tabled", and if brought to reality at some future date, the Group could then be expanded to 28 breeds.

The Bald Dachshund would derive from the Smooths, but would take special study and true dedication to develop a desirable "Pattern". Plain "Bald" would be unattractive. We have a sound basis on which to build bald ears, sides of head, sides of body and tails, but this could be made more attractive by selection. I suggest that we incorporate and promote the growth of "crests" that we sometimes see in Dachshunds. The Crest might be further developed, along with the elongation of whiskers, and the "patch of strong-growing hair" under the tail. Borrowing "tufts" of hair between the toes

from Longhairs would complete the picture. The end result could be both elegant and unique. For showing purposes great care must be taken to prevent shaving less-than-true Balds. Since razor burn could never be considered an "honorable scar" it would have to result in disqualification.

The Fluffy Coated Dachshund would be relative easy to establish by selecting very judiciously from the existing wirehaired gene pool While there might be incentive to "borrow" a fluffy coat from another breed, the loss of true Dachshund type would soon discourage this. We must be sure that AKC would continue to regard the coats as "varieties". Since not only wire, smooth and longhaired puppies could show up in litters of "fluffies", but curly and bald as well. The Fluffy Dachshund would almost surely have to be protected from the

ravages of over-popularity. We must also immediately establish an acceptable "Show Trim", since there is little doubt that in the hands of professional handlers, a fluffy "trim" would emerge. A suggest trim is shown below. In addition to sculpting, the Fluffy Dachshund might also be subject to shady shading. This must be arrested before it begins since I can think of no greater horror than a Dachshund in a dye-pot.

Combined with the myriad of existing colors of the Dachshund, it could be a glorious array of Dachshunds we would present to the world. I foresee the following placements in Group 8:


Fourth – Miniature Chocolate Fluffy

Third – Giant Piebald Bald Second – Tweenie Wheaten Wirehair


First – Standard Red Smooth (some things never change.)







Minutes of last meeting were ap-

proved and printed in the Digest. Secretary's report: No new correspondence has been received. **Treasurer's report:** Sandy reported a current balance of \$38,111.98. PayPal option for payment is working well. Members need to be reminded to use Friends and Family option to avoid fees for both member and club. Otherwise, \$5 is added to transaction to cover cost. This needs to be published in the Digest as a reminder.

A new webmaster is needed. Janice Corey-Finney will post the

post the position on the Website.

Committee reports

Review of breed standard committee: Laura Licht, Chair, Carol Burton (longs), Cliff Ramos (smooths), Marie Dorris (wires) The following changes were proposed by the committee: Replace American Field Trials with American performance events in the description of the miniature dachshund.

Replace the description of size: With correct bone, substance, proportion and soundness, the preferred weight of the Miniature Dachshund should not exceed 11 pounds. Obviously oversized specimens or specimens with any appearance of weediness or toyishness should be severely penalized.

Under temperament, change "without any signs of shyness or aggression" to:

Dogs showing signs of shyness or aggression should be severely penalized.

Dianne proposed the following addition to teeth: An even bite is a minor fault; any other deviation

is a serious fault.

Janelle moved to accept the revisions to the breed standard. Pat seconded and the motion passed. Dianne agreed to mail the ballots for the approval of the proposed standard revision by the membership. Sandy will supply labels, David will count the votes.

Nominating committee: David Temple, Chair reported that Pat Taylor, Jyl Scott, Cindy Niles were the members of the nominating committee. The slate that was published in the Digest is unopposed as no petitions were received by the deadline. The secretary is instructed to cast a unanimous ballot in favor of: President: Aubrey Nash, First VP: Laura Abbott-Licht, Second VP: Dianne Graham, Third VP: Kim Ragsdale, Secretary: Janelle McCord; Treasurer: Sandy Combs, Directors: Karen Osbourne, Terry Carr-Hall, Pat Hodges, Tara Hartman, David Temple, Janice Corey-Finney. These results will be published in the Digest.

Rescue: It was determined that the club can no longer support rescue because it is not covered

by our insurance policy. Individual members are encouraged to support rescue efforts as they see fit.

Advisory committee: The advisory committee has been a tradition, but without a real function. David moved to dissolve the advisory committee. Sandy seconded and the motion passed. Membership: The application of Jennifer Scott was read and approved.

Unfinished business:

DCA has yet to provide updated standard information to judges concerning the piebald. NMDC provided a letter and a pamphlet to Carl Holder, DCA President. but has not received a response. This information was prepared to update judges who had previously received a letter from DCA encouraging them to excuse piebalds. Now that the DCA membership voted to include piebalds in the breed standard for the dachshund, dachshund judges need to be updated. Aubrey will contact Carl for follow up. Digest: The September Digest received so many ads that Hollie had to remove some articles.

We are limited to 48 pages. The professional look and color copy, the themed issues as well as the distribution to all hound group judges have created a demand for ads. It is suggested that members wishing to use both a photo and pedigree in their ad purchase 2 pages side by side to avoid making the pedigree unreadable. This will be published in the Digest.

2018 Show

Show Chair Pat Hodges reported on the details of the National Specialty. The judge's contract stipulates a fee up to \$150 plus one-night lodging. The judge has been invited to stay for dinner and will receive a T shirt as well. Glenn Lycan, who approved our show for AKC, was invited to dinner but is unable to attend. Pat reported on donations for the show, including Mr. Wags (ven-

dor) and Marie Dorris (copper dachshund bracelets).

Kim reported that the engraver that has been creating our trophy items is disabled. She will create trophy cards so that winners can indicate if they want the item and she will get them created. In the future, trophies may consist of medallions without pen sets, etc.

2019 Show

Aubrey is working with Robbie Lloyd to plan our 2019 National Specialty show in Springfield, Missouri. The host hotel will be the Best Western, which is willing to reserve 25 rooms around a green space, provide space for dinner and meeting. The board meeting will be held on Thursday, November 7 in the afternoon with arrangements for morning show for dachshunds. The National Specialty will be Friday, alongside the all-breed shows in a different section of the same building. The dinner will be Saturday night.

This is in conjunction with a four day all breed cluster. Judge suggestions for all breed shows should be able to judge at least 2 groups and will be contributed
