Brucella canis is a bacterium that causes subtle, vet harmful reproductive disorders in dogs. While many dogs may not exhibit clinical signs, characteristic indicators include abortions between 45 and 60 days of gestation in females, testicular inflammation in males, and infertility in both sexes. Because the disease often goes unnoticed and the bacteria are shed in bodily secretions, the disease can spread rapidly throughout a kennel. The bacterium was first identified in dogs in 1966, particularly associated with Beagles in research colonies, and has since been found worldwide dog in many breeds including Australian Shepherds, Boston Terriers, Chihuahuas, Dachshunds, Golden Retrievers, Lhasa Apsos, Miniature Pinschers, Pomeranians, Poodles, Shih Tzus, Yorkshire Terriers, and mix-breed dogs. Over the past forty years the number of B. canis cases has increased throughout the US. Oklahoma Prevalence in alone rose from 2% in 1994-95 to 13% in 2002-3, corresponding to increasing costs associated with reproduction losses due to canine brucellosis and euthanasia of infected dogs. Although some dog breeders have attributed this rise in disease to husbandry practices or operations like "puppy-mills," this disease is being seen in many reputable kennels as well.

Similar to the other five Brucella species (abortus, melitensis, neotomae,

ovis, suis), this disease is zoonotic with the ability to infect humans, increasing the need for accurate diagnosis and control.

While not as virulent as its sister species Brucella abortus, which causes undulant fever in humans, B. canis has the potential to chronically infect people and cause flulike symptoms such as fever, chills, fatigue, weakness, enlarged lymph nodes, and weight loss. Source of infection is typically through contact with aborting bitches but can occur through any exposure to infected animals, tissues such as placenta or aborted feti, or secretions including vaginal discharge, semen, blood, milk, and urine. The current diagnostic gold standard is bacterial culture from blood or reproductive tissues. Unfortunately, Brucella is difficult to culture making false negative results common. Serological tests such as the ME-RSAT.

TAT, and AGID adequately detect disease 8-12 weeks post-infection, but these tests cannot detect early disease, from time of infection until there are detectable levels of anti-Brucella antibody present.

Law in several states lists canine brucellosis a reportable disease subject to quarantine. Testing of all breeding animals and euthanasia of infected animals is required once a kennel becomes quarantined. Perpetuation of canine brucellosis is due largely to the perceived negative implications

Where Have all the pupplies gone? by Peri Norman Reprinted with CHRONICLE

A friend and I were discussing upcoming shows, entries and points. In the course of the conversation, she bemoaned the fact that entries are down in her breed at all the shows because no one had any puppies last year. While there are many factors that contribute to entries at the dog show, from perceived quality of judges and attractiveness of the venue, to the scheduling of specialty club meetings and maybe a particularly desirable trophy, the bottom line reality of our sport is that we need puppies.

Puppies are sold to buyers who may be long-time competitors in dog sports or they may go to people who haven't yet experienced the joy of a Winners ribbon or a qualifying agility run. We can talk about improving our events. We can encourage and support beginners. We can join a club and help put on an event. But in the end, we must have puppies. Nothing we do can motivate a person like the sweet smell of puppy breath and the promise of years of companionship. In the not too distant past, I mentored a gal with her first show dog. Seven years later, she owns three champion dogs and has bred a number of litters. I think it is important to note that she had owned the breed of her choice since childhood, but only recently as an established professional in her career did she decide to try showing. Once she got that first ribbon, the progression to breeding was easy because she already had a life-long passion for her breed. Other breeders thanked me for mentoring her (actually, the breeder she bought her first show dog from did most of the heavy lifting, not the least of which was selling her a lovely show quality bitch).



"Our breed needs new, young breeders," they would say. Yes, we do! No breed is excluded from this need. Experienced breeders realize that educating and nurturing the next generation of breeders is every bit as important as raising the pups themselves.

Our sport has changed dramatically in just the last twenty-plus years. In the words of Lisa Dubé Forman, "Since 1992, the AKC registry has experienced momentous losses in dog registrations and if you are not up-to-date on these losses, the numbers are alarming. AKC's peak year for registrations was 1992 with approximately 1.5 million dogs registered. In 2010, the total annual AKC dog registrations was 563,611. This is a staggering 63% decrease in annual dog registrations..." To put it another way, 2010 saw about one million dogs less registered than just eighteen years earlier in 1992. It's mind boggling!

The leadership of the American Kennel Club last reported registration numbers back in 2010. The second sentence of the 2016 Annual report reads, "The year saw an overall 8 percent increase in registrations", but since we have not received actual numbers for the past five years, that figure really doesn't tell us what we need to know. Hiding information from the breeders and fanciers does not help any of us address the issues at hand. It certainly has not reduced the amount of criticism or negative legislation directed at the purebred fancy. All it has done is deprived us of important information that will help us track our progress. A savvy observer will not be fooled by the reporting of increasing registration income versus actual registration numbers. While

getting more dogs registered (in large part through participants in the Breeder of Merit program) is wonderful, that money still comes from the faithful core, not necessarily from new breeders joining the ranks and breeding more puppies. Lest you think that this situation only affects fanciers, let me share a story. Somewhere in the early 2000s, I received a call from a gentleman in search of a pup. His name was Chris. Scary, but I still remember him! After talking with him for some time, I explained that we did not have any litters planned but I would

be happy to help him in his search for a puppy from a responsible breeder. Over the next eighteen months, I must have referred him to a half dozen breeders who were expecting litters. Each time, he would call me

and explain that the litter didn't work out for him. Most commonly, there were no pet quality males available. We had become rather familiar with each other. He would have been a good, loving home for a dog, but breeders were giving priority to people who would show or trial a dog, and a loving pet home was dropped off the list time after time. The last time we talked, he cut loose with a colorful diatribe that basically involved the concept that "you people" need to breed more dogs so that there are pups for families who want a treasured companion! Make no mistake. Breeders wonder why the tide of public opinion has turned against us. They didn't turn against us. We shut them out. In our desire to protect and enhance our "reputations" within our own little kingdom, we moved the general public to the bottom of our priority list! And in doing so, we created fertile ground for the AR rhetoric because we were refusing to sell dogs to the general public. Not only are registrations falling precipitously, but the implementation and widespread usage of the limited registration option among high-end breeders even more severely limits breeding options. In the days of over 1 million dogs registered a year, a good number of those dogs came from "non-competitive" purebred breeders. Today, it is becoming difficult for the public to find a purebred dog, registered or not. John Q Public's options are a shelter/ rescue dog, a designer dog or waiting (per-



haps years) for what we consider a quality purebred dog. If the public could buy a dog from a educated, nonshow breeder versus a mixed mess, we might be able to stem the tide of anti-breeder sentiment that is so prevalent today. The image of purebred breeders

as elitist is not an image. It is real and we are making our own bed. Right now, that reality involves us having to a large degree eliminated "pet" breeders and the vacuum is being filled by random-bred shelter dogs, designer crossbreds and imported street dogs.

There are several basic tenets of old school dog breeding that we have to let go. It is hard when we have been doing the same things for so long to wrap our mind around making changes that go against the core of who we thought we were. But if our purebred dogs are to be saved and move into the future with healthy and sustainable populations, we must change. The first challenge we must overcome is the prejudice we have against non-competitive breeders (or even breeders who exhibit in a venue other that conformation). Back in the day, if a potential puppy buyer expressed a desire to acquire a breeding

regarding testing. Reporting infection with B. canis presently has both negative financial and dog-community effects, potentially leading to ostracization of breeders in some circles if they report disease in their own kennel or breed. The severity and increasing prevalence of canine brucellosis must be recognized and testing supported and performed in order to prevent further spread of this silent and serious disease.

Research has been funded by the AKC CHF to develop a quantitative Polymerase Chain Reaction (qPCR) assay to rapidly detect infection with Brucella with more specificity and sensitivity than current testing methods. Early detection of contagious disease in puppies newly exposed or breeding animals could shorten the quarantine period and would add a measure of safety for buyers of puppies or breeding stock. 

pair, emails flew alerting fellow breeders about inquiries from people who wanted to breed dogs. Oh, the horror! Instead of being so overly protective of our "lines", we need to mentor people who already have an interest and teach them to breed dogs responsibly. The definition of a responsible breeder has been discussed for eons, but let me propose a simple answer. A responsible breeder does two things; they breed dogs of good temperament and health, and they take back the dogs they bred without question for the lifetime of the dog. It is not about winning dog shows, agility trials or acquiring titles of any sort. It is not about coat color or texture, tail sets or ears. It is about breeding healthy, happy dogs and being sure that they always have a loving home regardless of the vagaries that life throws at the human side of the equation.

Another thing we must learn is to overcome the impulse to "test and exclude". In a bygone era, we, the community of AKC purebred dog breeders, had a million or so more dogs to choose from. So if a dog has a borderline hip x-ray or a punctate juvenile cataract, we just moved on to the next candidate. We don't have that luxury anymore. Otherwise quality dogs with minor defects or dogs that are tested as carriers of various conditions need to be bred! We are reaching the point of no return as both our actual numbers of dogs are plummeting and inbreeding in closed stud books is creating unsustainable populations of dogs due to lack of genetic diversity. A relative of "test and exclude" is "research and exclude". When breeders are forthright, we will know about a close relative, or maybe even multiple relatives of a dog that are affected by any given condition. It is shortsighted to exclude the relatives of these dogs from breeding programs. Instead, as a community of breeders we need to endeavor to use these dogs wisely, so that their attributes can be shared with future generations and their potential weaknesses minimized. If you think about it, this is equivalent to

breeding for health, the same way we have bred for specific physical traits all these many years. Selecting breeding pairs that cross fault for health conditions is reasonable and appropriate. With the aid of some of the newer genetic tests, it may soon become much less difficult and time consuming than it used to be. We need more quality animals for us and the non-competitive homes. Think about our current situation. Breeds with of thousands of dogs have an effective population size of far less than the 100 animal effective population size considered to be sustainable by those working in wildlife conservation. In our fervor to "protect" our bloodlines, we have not only dramatically reduced the number of dogs being produced, but we have spayed and neutered all but one or two dogs from each litter, effectively creating a tidal wave of miniature genetic bottlenecks with each litter. Is it really such a disaster to have more than the "chosen two" from each litter bred? If John O Public has a choice between a non-show quality purebred or an domestic cross-bred or imported street dog, not only is it to the advantage of a thoughtful buyer to acquire a purebred dog, it is to OUR advantage for them to do so. The truth is no responsible breeder has killed any shelter dogs, but we have most certainly removed the choice of a purebred dog from many families. It is unclear who is suffering the worst from this situation, the American family or the purebred fanciers, but it is clear that no one can fix this but us! The first step in the right direction is to breed more purebred puppies. In the last forty years, we have become skilled in the creation and continuation of philosophies designed to limit breeding of purebred dogs. The test in front of us is the development of a new paradigm that embraces inclusion. A responsibly-bred, AKC registered dog brings joy to people's lives. We need more joy!
