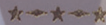

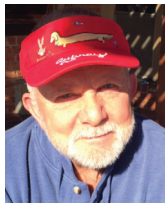

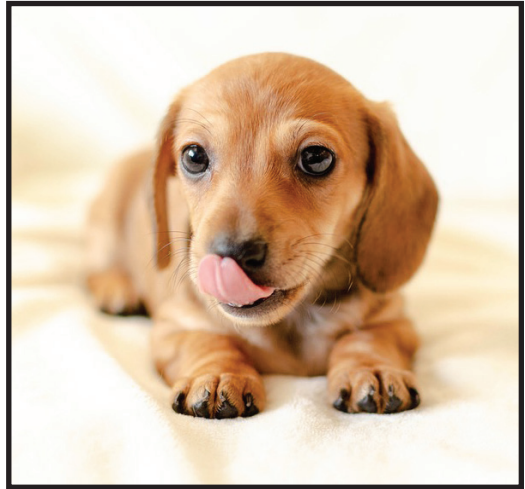

What are the Possible Genetics of a Cream Coated Dachshund?

Member of the NMDC for a number of years and has been breeding and showing miniature dachshunds for over 30 years. A retired fisheries research biologist from the state of Montana.

I have been breeding and showing miniature dachshunds for over 30 years with a primary interest in the smooth coat, and then we ventured into wirehair and finally the longhairs. With the latter came a “new” coat color to me, the cream. I heard terms like; American cream, English cream, shaded cream, black and cream, brindled cream, etc. No one seemed to have a good explanation of the genetics behind “the cream color”. While I am not a geneticist, I am a retired fisheries research biologist with a reasonably good understanding of basic genetics. Prior to the



development of new genetic testing, good explanations for the appearance of various dachshund coat colors were hard to find, particularly the cream color. A couple of years ago I put my thoughts about the cream coat color on our webpage theorizing possible genetic explanations for the color.

The following are some genetic terms used in this discussion: Alleles-are genes in pairs (one

from each parent) with the dominant gene shown in capital letters and the recessive gene shown in lower case.

Locus- genes and locus are used interchangeably and was used when the location of the genes was not known.

Dominant and recessive genes- It takes two recessive genes in the allele to be expressed in the phenotype.

Phenotype/genotype- The genotype is the actual genetic makeup of the allele such as EE, Ee or ee, while the phenotype is what is expressed with EE and Ee showing the same phenotype and ee being the recessive expression in the phenotype.

At that time, there were four genetic possibilities for the cream color: 1) the dilute red in which the basic red coat color is diluted by the double recessive allele on the D locus; 2) the red coat color is modified from the E-locus again with the double recessive allele; 3) the possible

presence of a chinchilla allele on the C-locus which again is a double recessive allele; and 4) the possible existence of a gene controlling the intensity of the red color located on the I-locus and again may be doubled recessive. While there were no know genetic tests for the chinchilla (chch) gene or the intensity (ii) gene, there were tests for the dilute (dd) and the extension (ee) gene. Neither of the latter tests fully explained the cream coat color.

Recently, a test for the existence and detection of the “Intensity” allele on the I-locus has been developed and is available for breeders. This allele apparently regulates the intensity of the red hair color in which the dominant form II or Ii allows the normal red color to express itself, but with the double recessive form, the red color is diluted to a much lighter shade “cream”. To my knowledge, this dilution allele is not accompanied with the

The Keel: It's Not Decorative!



In the AKC's hound group, "keel" is a word that can be found in three breeds: The Azawakh, the Bloodhound, and the Dachshund, but only one of the breeds uses the word as if it were an anatomical part, whereas the other two use the word to describe a shape.

In the Azawakh, the chest "is curved like a keel," and in the Bloodhound, the "chest [is] well let down between the forelegs, forming a deep keel. In the Dachshund standard section on Forequarters,

however, the dog's "keel merges gradually into abdomen & extends well beyond front legs."

This is an apt description for a breed that can sit on its "keel" (chest) as it digs furiously towards its prey. A Dachshund needs to have a deep chest with her elbows well above her keel to allow ample capacity for the heart and lungs. This front structure also gives her room for her legs both front and rear, but her keel must be smooth or she'll be hampered by tree or grass roots as she backs

out. This is one reason why the standard reads, “Keel merges gradually into abdomen & extends well beyond front legs.”

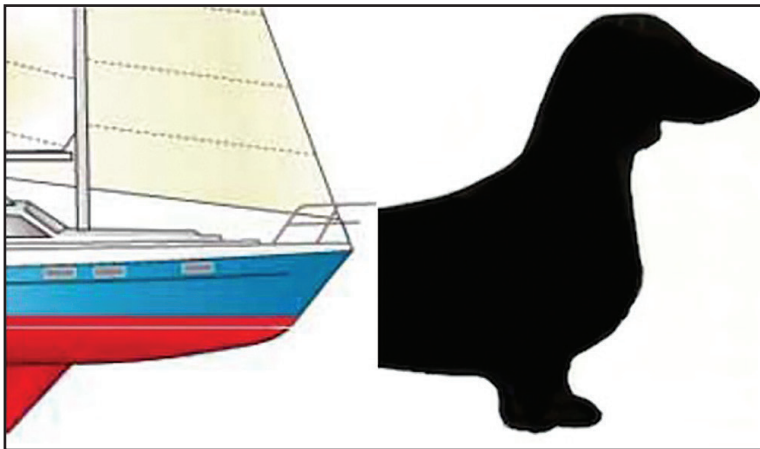
One thing that might be misunderstood in this breed is “clearance.” Yes, the Dachshund is a long and low slung breed, but this means lowness from the withers, not a lack of ground clearance. We always defer to breed experts, but our understanding is that a

general rule of thumb is that the height from the withers to the bottom of the keel should be approximately 75% of the total height from the withers to the ground.

The Dachshund really is a marvel of “engineering,” and is Exhibit A of “form following function.”

Protect Your Dog From These Top 10 Pet Poisons

As an emergency veterinarian for over thirty years, I've found that despite your best efforts, accidents happen even to the best owners. Your pet may gain access to a potentially harmful or fatal substance. Many toxins are common items in your home and yard. Some poisons are rather obvious and easy to avoid, while others are not so easily identifiable so it's important that you educate yourself and keep these poisons out of reach of your pet. Here are some helpful tips about how to poison-proof your home and to know what happens if your pet does ingest a harmful substance.

To help raise awareness, the

ASPCA Animal Poison Control Center (APCC) released its list of top ten animal toxins of 2020 after reviewing roughly 232,000 cases of potential animal poisoning.

-Over-the-counter medications ranked number one in pet toxins, accounting for nearly 20% of calls to the APCC. Common medications in this category are the drugs used to combat headaches, fevers and colds which include ibuprofen, naproxen, cold medications, certain herbal supplements and certain essential oils. **-Human prescription medications** accounted for 17.5% of all APCC cases. The most common medication were ADHD medica-

tions, antidepressants and heart medications.

-Food items such as grapes, raisins, onions, garlic and items containing xylitol, an artificial sweetener commonly used in baked items even toothpaste. Chocolate accounted for 10.1% of APCC cases. The darker the chocolate, the more potent the potential effects are. It is important to note that white chocolate is not toxic.

Veterinary medications accounted for 9.3% of cases. Many pet medications are flavored to increase palatability and make them taste good. Some pets may mistake these pet medications for dog treats. Remember that a “childproof container” does not mean pet-proof. Always keep all medications out of reach of children and pets.

Household items accounted for 7.3% of cases, including ingestion of anti-freeze, paint and cleaning products.

Rodenticide exposure increased to 6.3% of APCC cases. There are two major categories of rodenticides: anti-coagulants and those causing brain effects.

Insecticide exposure accounted for 6.2% of cases.

Plants accounted for 5.5% of

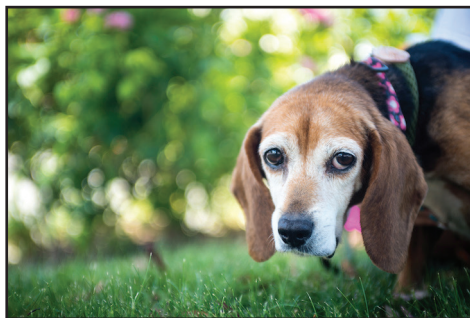
cases, including some indoor and outdoor plants and notably bouquets containing lilies so toxic to cats and so common during Easter season.

Garden products round out the list at number 10, accounting for 2.3% of APCC cases. Many pets find fertilizer irresistible.

Though it did not make this top ten list, the APCC is also getting an increasing number of calls about marijuana and CBD products, especially edibles. Edible products are not regulated and may contain a high amount of THC which could lead to low blood pressure, coma, and even death.

Symptoms of Toxicity

With some poisons, you may have a reaction within minutes of ingestion. With other poisons, such as certain rat poisons, it may take several days before you notice any symptoms. Here are

some toxicity symptoms:

Vomiting

Loss of appetite

Diarrhea

Lethargy or weakness

Pale or yellowish gums

Excessive thirst or urination

Nervousness, hyperactivity, muscle tremors or coma

Pet-Proofing Your Home

Pets are like children – they can't resist investigating and putting things in their mouths. That's why poison-proofing your home is so important. Here are some important steps from the Pet Poison Helpline that can make your home safer for pets:

Make sure your houseplants are non-toxic. Check out lists of poisonous plants on the ASP-CA guide of toxic plants before purchasing and bringing them home.

Store medications in secure area and out of reach of pets.

Secure garbage cans behind closed doors.

Keep ashtrays, cigarettes, and smoking cessation products out

of reach.

Put your purse in an area where your pets cannot access it.

Keep pets out of the room when using toilet cleaners or other cleaning products.

If you use an automatic toilet bowl cleaner, always close the toilet lid.

Keep rodenticides (rat poison) out of reach from your pets.

Never use flea and tick products made for dogs on your cat.

Keep glue out of reach. Some glues, such as Gorilla Glue®, expand greatly once ingested and require surgical removal. Just one ounce of glue may expand to the size of a basketball.

Read all labels and instructions before using or applying.

If you think that your pet may have ingested any of these poisons or any other questionable substances, contact your veterinarian or the Pet Poison Helpline at (855) -764-7661 (incident fee applies) immediately. It will be very helpful if you can identify the substance and bring the package, label, or picture of it with you.

alopecia issues associated with the recessive form of the D-dilution allele and only dilutes the red hair color.

Four Possible Genetic Combinations for Cream Coated Dachshunds

-Cream coated with some black hair with black nose leather and toenails. The A-allele is either AyAy or Ayat, D-allele dominant with dominant combination of either (DD or Dd), Extension allele either (EE or Ee) and the double recessive Intensity allele (ii). This could include both shaded cream and cream.

-This cream coat would have no black hair with light colored whiskers. The A-allele is either (AyAy or Ayat) - D-allele is dominant (DD or Dd), extension allele is double recessive (ee) and the intensity allele would be double recessive (ii). These could be the clear cream coat (my speculation).

-This cream coat would have accompanying bluish nose leather and toenails. The red coat color (AyAy or Ayat) and other colors are diluted by the D-allele double recessive (dd). This allele is also accompanied with alopecia.

-Many believe that the English Cream is caused by the presence of a double recessive allele on the C-locus the chinchilla gene. The existence of this (chch) allele has not been proven to exist; in fact genetic studies of the C-locus suggest that there are no verifiable mutations of this locus, except for albinism which is recessive to the dominant gene (C) which allows normal color production.

These genetic tests are available at many genetic labs and we use PawPrints Genetics in Spokane, WA.
